About Us

Hope 4 Young Girls Tanzania is a nonprofit organization that works to help and empower the most disadvantaged and vulnerable Tanzanian girls in the areas of health, education support, social and gender equality. We focus on raising awareness on various risk factors faced by teenage girls such as lack of education regarding their basic rights, sexual reproductive health, and lack of peer and adult support. All of these make them vulnerable to sexual, physical and psychological abuse, adolescent pregnancy and HIV infections. We work to provide practical support through education and peer support to improve young girls' quality of life, advance their rights, and give them a chance for a better future. We hope to achieve our goals with the help of corporate and private support, and the generosity of our volunteers and friends who provide both their time and financial support

VISION: To empower girls to become leaders, independent and confident

MISSION: To provide supportive environment that educates and inspires girls to reach their potential and fulfilling future

OUR APPROACH: Involves relevant stakeholders' i.e Girls, parents/guardians, school teachers, communities and government by conducting community dialogues, school clubs, forums that discuss challenges and solutions that hinders girls the right to education

Some highlights of our impact 2019

- The Right to be a girl project: Conducted in 2 districts of Tanga and Pwani. Tanga districts, Handeni and Muheza while Pwani we covered Mkuranga district.
- Launching of Tuanzie Nyumbani project :this resulted into an establishment of Hope Nyumbani clubs and reached 200 families and 85 girls
- Training of 8 community volunteers.
- Participated in National Girls right advocating events
 - i) Ammend of the child marriage act case by Rebeca Gyumi / MI
 - ii) Ending Gender based Violence by BrightJamii, Savethechildren & Plan International
 - iii)Ending Child Marriage by Ending Child Marriage Network
 - iv)International Youth Day
 - v)MenEngage Africa
- H4YG saved 5 girls who were to get married by working with community volunteers that informed, we took an initiative of visiting the family to explain that child marriage denies girls right to education and expose girls to GBV and the wedding were called off.



01 Strategy

01. PROTECTION OF GIRLS RIGHTS FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

This strategy revolves on the National Plan of Action to end Violence against Women and Children established by the Government of Tanzania under MOHCDGEC ,PO –RALG.

H4YG received fund from Mundo Cooperante in 2019 and continue with our program of the The right to be a girl which focused on raising awareness about Child Marriage to school girls, out of schools, parents ,teachers ,healthy teachers and community at large to come together against child marriage. The medium of communication used was cultural dances, community dialogues, Theatre for change, training, and meeting with different stakeholders like parents, boys and girls in secondary schools, religious leaders etc.

The project focused on giving education to reduce child marriage and its effects to girls and society .All the stakeholders were advised to focus giving girl child education and not marrying the girls. This program reached about 7,000 people in areas where it was conducted .This project based in Tanga and Coast regions, Awareness was also created about increase of minimal legal marriage age for young girls and sexual and reproductive health education.





Bicycle was also provided to 40 girls who walked about 10 - 15Km to school in Mkuranga districts as one of the way to reduce the chances of them being deceived on their way to school and reduce child marriage.

The project was conducted in two districts of Tanga region particularly Handeni and Muheza districts. In Handeni the program covered 4 wards Kwaluguru, Sindeni, Kwabalanga and Mkonje. Muheza districts we focused on 2 wards which is Mtindiro and Kilulu.

2. SOCIETY AS A FOREFRONT INVOLVEMENT IN ADVOCATING GIRLS RIGHT.

In ensuring society plays a vital role in advocating for girls and women rights H4YG uses an approach of **“Let’s Begin at Home” (Tuanzie Nyumbani)**, This program aimed to reach the girls who are not at school, those who did not get the chance to go to school or the ones who are not able to continue with their studies due various issues.

The approach applied is public dialogues whereby all key stakeholders like parents, street/ward leader’s young girls and boys are involved. This also aimed to showcase challenges faced by girls, women and parents towards protecting girls and women.



Tuanzie Nyumbani (Lets begin at home program) has given parents/guardians, girls and street /ward leaders to express challenges faced by girls at homes and how society can stop and take actions. Through this approach 2 wards were covered that is Kijitonyama and Kigogo Mwisho in Dar es Salaam. This approach reached about 200 families in all wards involved.85 girls were reached in total from all the families. Let's begin at home dialogues covered topics of gender equality, gender mainstreaming, gender based violences,childrens rights and girls and women roles .The program covered topics on Gender desks.



The program identified various cases of abuse and violence towards young girls was reported on Gender desks. The cases reported were child marriage, teen pregnancies and physical abuse. Hope 4 Young Girls Tanzania (H4YG) established Hope Nyumbani club, at Handeni district Kwalugulu ward .The committee take responsibility of having community meetings on GBV to identify causes and remedies. Hope facilitates education on how to report the violence by engaging community at large.

03. EMPOWERING WOMEN AND GIRLS TO STAND AND SPEAK FOR THEIR RIGHTS



It is critical girls are able to stand for their rights so as to conquer their dreams and goals in life. Hope 4 Young Girls believes youth have to be enhanced to speak about their rights and other things concerning their welfare. The approach used is Girls speak out whereby girls and boys are invited in to air out their opinions on Sexual reproductive health, Gender equity, Education policies, Child Marriage and Gender based Violence. To date H4YG has reached 48 girls in Dar es Salaam and plan to conduct more in days to come.





However in Handeni District in Tanga region H4YG created Community Volunteers groups for establishment and monitoring of schools clubs established in Kwabalanga and Sindeni wards. The school clubs aims at creating awareness about Child Marriage and Gender equity.
