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Message from the Executive Director



In 2022, the Hope 4 Young Girls experienced a transformative year, by achieving a positive impact on the lives of thousands of adolescent girls, young women's and community. As we approach the publication of our 2022 annual report, we are proud to share with you the journey of our 12 months programs, what we have achieved and what was the challenges in providing education to both, In and out of school girls and community engagement, Despite of some financial challenges but we have been able to use our own resources to make sure we achieve our targeted goals as we planned.

In 2022 Hope 4 Young Girls worked direct in community by 89%, we reached 482400 people through girls safe spaces, sexual reproductive health education in schools, economic empowerment program, Gender based violence, Roll model program in schools, gender equality, entrepreneurship skills, Kindness month campaign, media and community engagement, participation in other organization programs and stakeholders meeting. Our interventions in economic empowerment have contributed to improving the living conditions of young women in Kilosa district - Morogoro region.

Our intervention in protection and participation contibuted to increase school performance and reduced of school dropout to adolescent girls in Handeni district - Tanga region and Morogoro region. In 2022 we successfully supported people living with disabilities by giving them 45 wheelchairs to enable them go to school and enjoy their rights to education.

We express our gratitude to our Government, supporters, friends, family for their endless support.

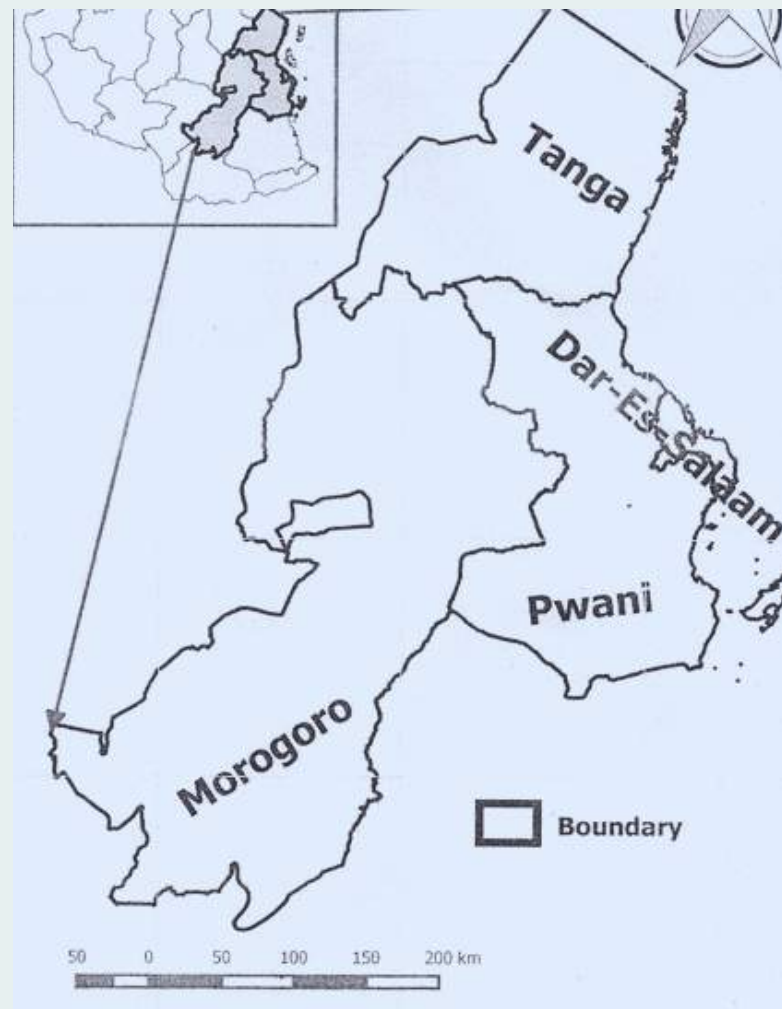

Hope 4 Young Girls envisages a Tanzanian society that upholds young girls' rights and takes initiative for social change.

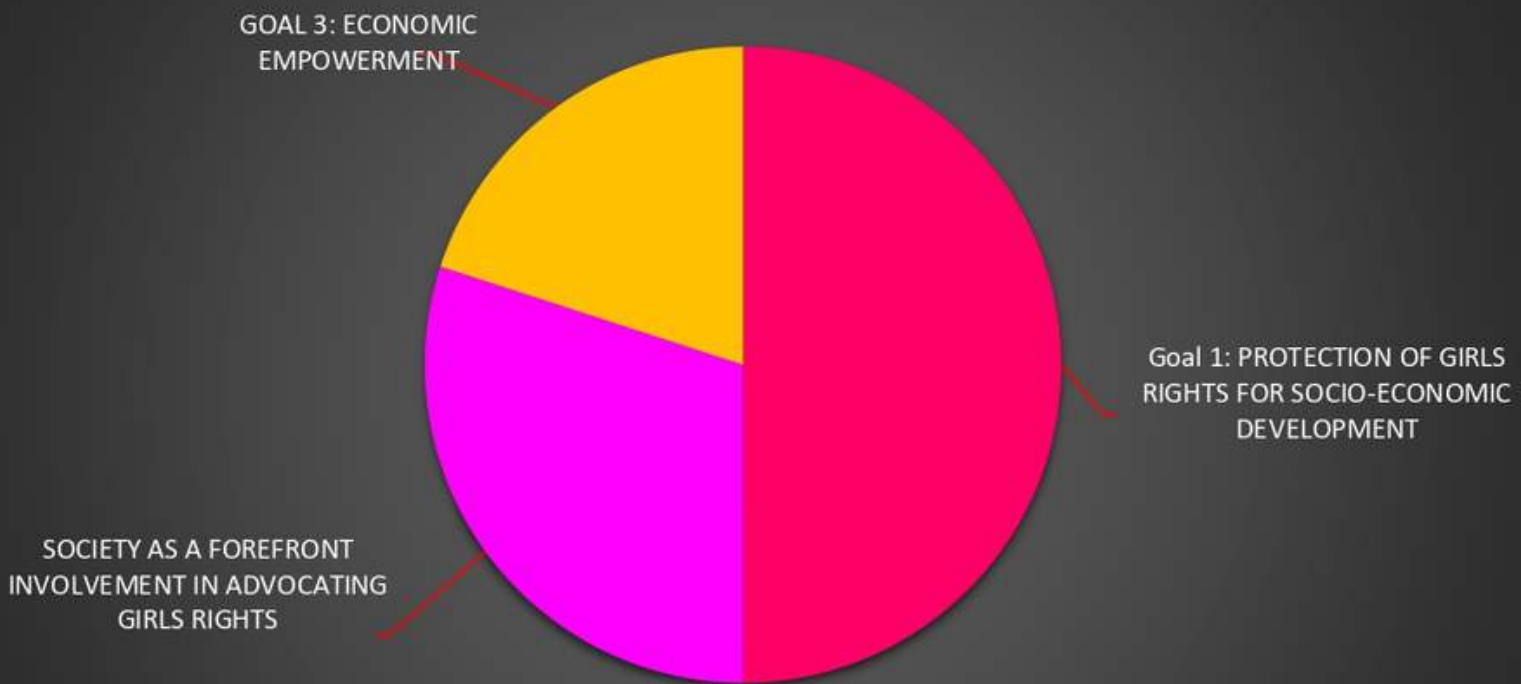

PROTECTION OF GIRLS RIGHTS FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Adolescent girls received Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights awareness education



The Hope 4 Young Girls prioritized sexual and reproductive health (SRH) programs. This included teenage pregnancies, non-communicable disease, and psychosocial support (PSS). The programs aligned with the Strategic Plan and integrated with the protection program, utilizing girls friendly Spaces and support services. This approach reduced early pregnancies and improved health outcomes. With the support of local government officials and community volunteers we also conducted door-to-door visits to raise awareness to outside of school young women

The program reached to 2 districts in (Morogoro and Tanga region).1,950 young women and adolescent girls received education which lowered the rate of teenage pregnancies and school drop out plus non communicable disease.

The expansion of the location ,activities and partnership efforts contributed to positive SRH outcomes while promoting inclusivity and resilience.

Adolescent girls and young women's received gender based violence education

Hope 4 Young Girls committed to its vision of ending gender based violence by empowering adolescent girls ,young women's and engaging communities, stakeholders, decision makers to have a voice and influence over operations and programs. The organization actively strives to eliminate all systemic forms of discrimination and fosters an inclusive environment where everyone is respected, heard, valued, and supported.

In this strategic goal, we conducted gender based awareness to 6 schools,we let girls share experience of violence in their communities and school,most of girls they opted to use paper writing where we received 150 piece of paper of girls experienced sexual violence from their close family members and schools.

Challenges: Girls still struggling to get a trusted place where they can report violence cases.

Lesson learnt : Girls fails to perform well because of violence they experienced in their communities.

4 schools - 1260 girls were reached through roll model program.

In this program Hope 4 Young Girls trained girls on how to identify and follow the good examples of the roll models to increase their performance, participation and positive attitudes from their roll models.

From this activity girls drew the picture of their roll models and explained why they follow them and what is good to copy from them and how the roll models will support them in education and achieve their dreams.

5 GIRLS SAFE SPACES CREATED

In 2022, we created girls and young women's safe spaces where they can go at any time and make them feel safer to share experience, have fun, learn and have access to information.



We feel more safe and free when we meet with other girls and discuss issues concerning our education and social activities.

GOAL 2: ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

120

120 out-of-school girls received entrepreneurship training and capital and started their business.



Economic empowerment is one of our thematic area which we use to help reduce domestic violence, dependence and teenage pregnancy.

In 2022 Hope 4 Young Girls conducted entrepreneurship training to 120 girls who were identified through need assessment forms. Girls were trained on liquid soap making, poultry farming, smart Genge and hand made handbag. This approach reduced early pregnancies and improved economic outcomes.

Lesson learnt: There are still a huge number of out of school girls need to be empowered economically.

ECONOMIC SUPPORT

I was forced to get married by my parents when I was 16yrs, Then my husband got an accident and died, left me with one child (son), All the staff he left his parents took away from me and I didn't know where to start.

There was a time I could not even manage to buy food for my child.
I thank Hope 4 Young Girls for assisted us with entrepreneurship training and capital, now I can support my child, family and myself.

Community open dialogue

Hope 4 Young Girls conducted open community dialogue to 4 villages of kidete ward - Morogoro region.

In 2022, we coordinated community dialogue to raise awareness on strengthening protection of a girl child and how community can play a big role on ending gender based violence and create friendly environment for girls and young women to participate in the local meetings and give them the position to make decision to choose the future they want.

GOAL 3: SOCIETY AS A FOREFRONT INVOLVEMENT IN ADVOCATING GIRLS' RIGHTS

WOMEN PREVENTING VIOLENT EXTREMISM

As one of the Sisters Without Borders network member, we partnered with other 10 members to implement and responding to violent extremism. Hope 4 Young Girls Tanzania together with other sub award grantees participated in the training and implemented sub activities to the community level with the focus on Women Preventing Violent Extremism in Bagamoyo district.

The training content and the designed activities were influenced by the outputs from community dialogue which stipulated the main drivers to violence/conflicts and obstacles and opportunities for enhancing WP-VPPS in the project areas. The activities were divided in three thematic areas being: Women Empowerment, Awareness Creation and Legal Framework.

The activity impacted more than 1000 plus in Bagamoyo district.

About Kindness Month Campaign

Mwezi WA Ukarimu (Kindness Month) is a campaign that has started since 2017 and has been taking place at the end of every year in December. The campaign aims at supporting underprivileged people; living with disabilities, patients in hospitals, orphans, students, elders and street children with a special needs.

Hope 4 Young Girls has been engaging and collaborating with government leaders, different National and International Companies, NGO's, Embassies and people who are willing to contribute to the Campaign. This campaign support the people who are not direct in our focused groups, that why we thought of having a separate campaign where we can touch other peoples lives.

Approach

In 2022 we targeted to donate 75 wheelchairs and support children living with disabilities school kits, we used medias (Radio), social networks, WhatsApp groups and door to door to raise awareness on the right to education and the need of children living with disabilities,

We placed 10 fundraising boxes to different companies and international schools for donation.

Through this approach we were able to donate 45 wheelchairs and provide food and fare to the mothers who brought their children to event.

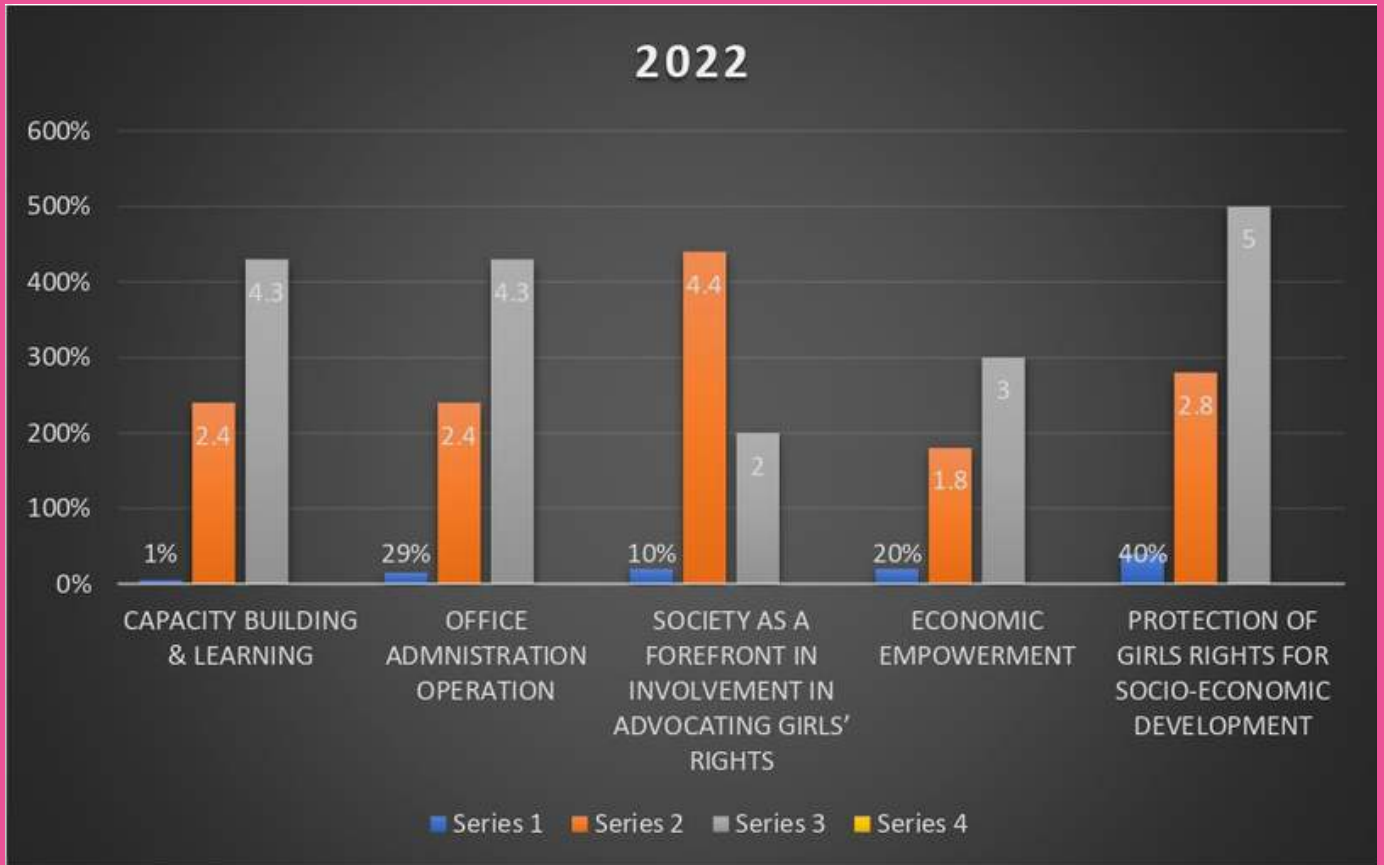

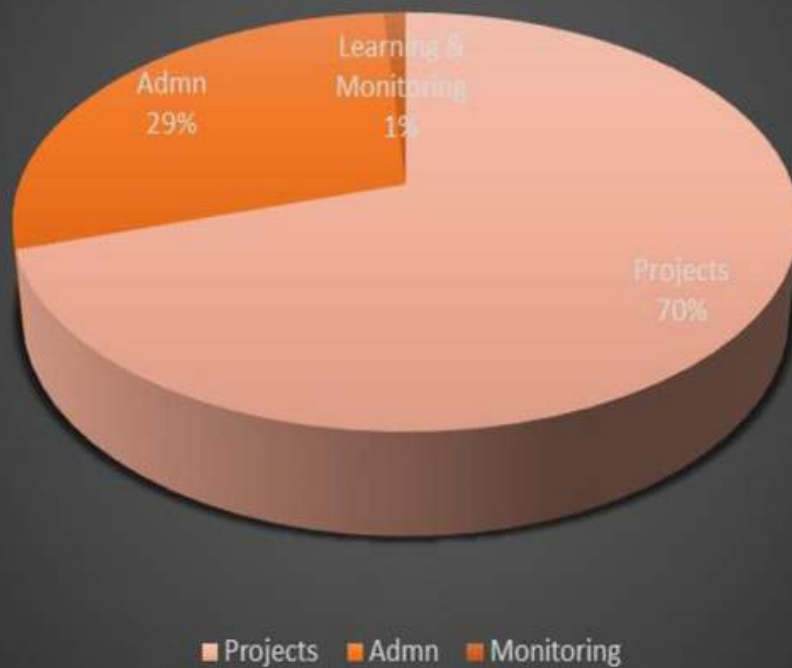
